#### JPIC venture in Loreto College:

Besides the usual relief given to the cyclone hit victims of the Sundarbans, Loreto College JPIC planned for long-term livelihood and environment sustainability in Netroberia village of the Sundarbans by distributing 1200 coconut seedling with compost and micronutrients to the victims. What was impressive was that the soil and water of the area were chemically tested for salinity, the village visited on more than one occasion and scientists consulted before this reach-out programme could be embarked on. Annual follow-up visits to observe the growth of the coconut trees, to

conduct workshops to train residents in the use of leaves and coir-craft are envisaged for the future.

#### International Women's Day:

8<sup>th</sup> March saw the introduction of the Women's Reservation Bill in *Indian Parliament, reserving 33%* seats in the Lok Sabha and State Assemblies for women. The resulting chaos in the Rajya Sabha caused by a few members left the 15 year old Bill hanging fire for one more day. The next day, on 9th March, it was passed by an overwhelming majority, but not without stormy scenes by a handful of protesters, who had to be bodily lifted from the scene! The question now is: How do we prepare for this opportunity for women empowerment and gender justice gained with such difficulty?
