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FROM THE MEMOIRS OF LORETO COLLEGE – 2017

MARY WARD DAY

On the 30th of January, 2017, the AICUF Society organized a programme in honour of our respected Founder, Mary Ward. The ceremony began with a short Prayer Service, followed by a reading from the Holy Bible. The choir sang maxims of Mary Ward; which made the little ceremony more meaningful. We also remembered in prayer, our very dear Sr. Ursula who recently returned to her eternal home. The programme left us feeling peaceful and spiritually rooted.

HISTORIA

On Mary Ward Day, 30th January, 2017, to commemorate 175 years of Loreto in South Asia, the Department of History and the History Society, initiated ‘*Historia*’, a meet aimed at providing a platform to the students of different colleges and universities of Kolkata. The Chief Guest at this event was Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Minister, Higher Education, West Bengal. Other dignitaries present at the session included the Guest of Honour, Dr. Jayanta Sengupta, Secretary and Curator of Victoria Memorial Hall and Director-in-charge of Indian Museum; and Keynote Speaker, Prof. Sudeshna Banerjee of the Department of History of Jadavpur University. Dr. Sengupta’s brief but incisive speech focused on the critical importance of research at the undergraduate level. The theme of Prof. Banerjee’s address was ‘Feminism and Women’s Empowerment’.

In the first session, research papers were presented, and the second session saw a debate in which five teams - Presidency University, Scottish Church College, St. Xavier’s College, Loreto College and Seth Soorajmull Jalan College, deliberated vigorously with convincing arguments and counter-arguments. The award for the best team, as well as the best speaker, was won by St. Xavier’s College. The ceremony ended with an evaluation on the success of ‘*Historia*’ and a call for the continuation of this endeavour by Loreto College.

INTER-YEAR VOCAL MUSIC AND DANCE COMPETITION

The Western Cultural Society of Loreto College organized an inter-year Vocal Music and Dance Competition. This fun, musical event was the first of its kind in the year 2017. Each event had two rounds - duet and group performances. The exuberant performances set the stage on fire and the students enjoyed themselves.

Ms. Bhasin, who is associated with an NGO SANGAT (South Asian Network of Gender Activists and Trainers), spoke with conviction laced with fire, about her on-going campaign and threw light on a very pertinent issue – *Feminism - challenges a woman faces at home and the need to assert oneself as equal with men in society*. She held her audience spell-bound interspersing electrifying deliberations on women's rights with couplets, which all in the auditorium joined in singing.

Later, in the evening Loreto College extended its solidarity to 'One Billion Rising'. Both students and faculty members participated in the campaign. Indeed, it was a memorable day!

IP ATTORNEY TALK

Mr. Biswajit Sarkar, along with a team from IP Attorney, visited Loreto College on February 21, 2017 for an interactive session on Intellectual Properties of India with special emphasis on Plagiarism and Cyber Crime. Mr. Sarkar enlightened the students regarding various aspects including *Patent, Trademark and Geographical Indication*. The discussion became all the more engaging and interactive because of the Power Point Presentation.

WOMEN'S



On the 28th of February, 2017, the Women's Cell of Loreto College celebrated twenty years of *empowerment of women through education*. It was even more special as it coincided with the 175th year of Loreto in South Asia.



A prayer song, an ancient Sanskrit hymn, about a common objective unifying everyone began the day. The guests included Sr. Anita Braganza, Ms. Nirmala Prabhawalkar, Prof. Malini Bhattacharya, Ms. Roshni Sen, Ms. Rohini Chowdhury, Mrs. Ratnaboli Banerjee, Ms. Anita Dutt and others.

The students of the Women's Cell then performed a Dance Drama, Yashodhara, the wife of Prince Siddhartha, celebrating Yashodhara whose sacrifice and devotion are often forgotten. It was a beautiful performance and was appreciated by everyone.

This was followed by a panel discussion on *empowering women through education*. The panellists enlightened the students about the importance of meaningful, inclusive and universal education and how education could be used as a tool to eliminate gender discrimination.

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

Loreto College kept up International Women's Day on the 8th of March. Emphasizing on the theme of the 2017 Campaign, *Be bold for Change*, the event commenced with a word of welcome. Recalling the heroic struggles of iron-willed ladies like Irom Sharmila and Malala Yousafzai, young minds were encouraged to strive for gender equality by breaking stereotypes. This was followed by the felicitation of Dr. Rotraut Roy Chowdhury, an alumnus of the Department of Education of Loreto College, for her selfless service to society. She stated instances from her own life and brought to light, a hear-rending fact that even in the 21st century working women are considered *NOT*

NORMAL WOMEN. She put emphasis on the development of a greater number of co-educational schools and building of soft skills such as emotional intelligence and anger management as a means by which the gender gap could be reduced in society.

This idea was carried forward as an interactive session by Dr. Nandita Bannerjee Dhawan, Asst. Professor at the School of Women's Studies at Jadavpur University, Kolkata. She explained how marriage and family, as two patriarchal institutions have limited the rights of women in both the public and private spheres of life. She concluded with a short film on women empowerment which emboldened the spirit of the young audience in the hall to stand up against abuse and discrimination. The event came to an end with a song entitled *Mann ke Manjeere*, motivating the audience to stand up for women's rights for gender equality.

HEALTH CAMP FOR THE NON TEACHING STAFF

- 2) Loreto Schools in India commit to making their schools carbon neutral by 2020

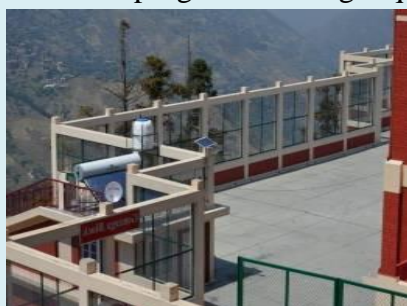

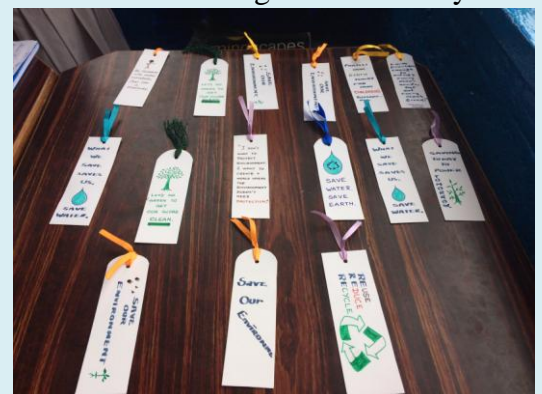


Dance was also presented to showcase the connection of Culture with

LORETO PRINCIPALS' MEET 2017

Sister Anita Braganza, Province Leader, the Council Members, Community Leaders, Principals and administrators of Loreto schools in India and Nepal- a total of 33 participants, were present at the annual Loreto Principals' Meet in Chail, near Shimla from 15th to 19th May, 2017.

Father Joe Kootinal was the Resource Person for the workshop on "Personal Growth." Sister Anita Braganza, in her inaugural address placed the topic in the context of the GC Calls and emphasised the need to transform ourselves to become harbingers of the "Good News".

The main focus of Father Joe Kootinal's workshop was the "Inside-Out Paradigm" as opposed to the "Outside-In" approach that resulted in "Diseases of Attitude" such as pessimism, doubt, negative criticism, complaining, gossip, indifference etc. The "Inside-Out" approach on the other hand taught us that personal and inter-personal effectiveness meant starting first with oneself- with the most 'inside' part of the self. As Father Kootinal summarised, "What makes me happy is not what I do but what I become."

To achieve this objective Father Joe Kootinal interspersed the course with various activities, stimulating group discussions, relevant video clippings, meditation techniques, self-reflection exercises and interesting anecdotes. He also proffered effective suggestions for overcoming the factors that hinder personal growth and by extension, professional growth as well. The objective of the workshop was encapsulated in a plan outlay on how the Loreto institutions could make a paradigmatic shift from 'Outside-in' to 'Inside-out'.

One day of the Meeting was devoted to presentations on internal matters that included Finance Management, Service Rules and the Loreto vision and philosophy. As one participant stated, "The Shimla Meet provided each participant with the space and the opportunity to journey deep into herself and derive ways of living the Gospel values in the 21st Century."
