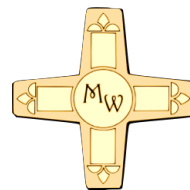

“Peace, in effect, is the fruit of a great political project grounded in the mutual responsibility and interdependence of human beings. But it is also a challenge that demands to be taken up ever anew. It entails a conversion of heart and soul; it is both interior and communal; and it has three inseparable aspects:

– peace with oneself, rejecting inflexibility, anger and impatience; in the words of Saint Francis de Sales, showing “a bit of sweetness towards oneself” in order to offer “a bit of sweetness to others”;

– peace with others: family members, friends, strangers, the poor and the suffering, being unafraid to encounter them and listen to what they have to say;

– peace with all creation, rediscovering the grandeur of God’s gift and our individual and shared responsibility as inhabitants of this world, citizens and builders of the future.”

JANUARY

1st: World Day of Peace

FEBRUARY

1st - 7th: World Interfaith Harmony week. Mutual understanding and interreligious dialogue constitute important dimensions of a culture of peace. May the World Interfaith Harmony week be a way to promote harmony between all people regardless of their faith.

4th: World cancer day. “each one of us has a personal story connected to cancer, making it a driving force behind world cancer day”. (Dr. Roger Dansey). Let’s raise awareness of cancer and encourage its prevention, detection and treatment all round the world.

6th: Zero Tolerance to Female Genital Mutilation. (FGM). “With dignity, health and well-being of millions of girls at stake, there is no time to waste. Together, we can and must end this harmful practice” (UN secretary General Antonio Guterres)

20th: World Day of Social Justice. “Migrant workers, like all workers, are entitled to fair treatment and fair treatment for migrant workers is also key to preserving the social fabric of our societies and to sustain development.” (Message from ILO Director- General, Mr Guy Ryders)

Social justice is an underlying principle for peaceful and prosperous coexistence within and among nations. We uphold the principles of social justice when we promote gender equality or the rights of indigenous peoples and Migrants. We advance social justice when we remove barriers that people face because of gender, age, race, ethnicity, religion, culture or disability.
