When it was proposed to me that I go to the mission in Morocco my whole being was taken aback. The idea truncated my plans including those of the current ministry with the National Conference for Religious which was aimed at promoting ecumenism in Spain. I could not say no to what was proposed but within me I felt a strong resistance – fear, darkness ... I had never offered to go to foreign missions because I did not consider myself capable.

In the midst of my fears I turned to the Lord: You know how I am, help me. And I asked Mary to place me with her Son. When I landed in Tangier my fears disappeared. From day one, the mission in Asilah filled me to the depths of my being. I never felt so close to God as I felt during that period.

I returned to Spain after almost thirteen years. I had been transformed and felt sad to leave that country. But I came to Madrid and was just in time to accompany my sister Rosario during the last two years of her life. Now, after being a religious for 63 years I can say that Jesus has been leading me by the hand. Sometimes I have released myself from Him, looking for my own autonomy. How wrong I was! However, He encountered me time and time again, leading me and filling me with His joy and happiness. *Gracias!*
